I would ride my bike out to Bob Chapman Ford and look through the windows of the Service Department in hopes of catching a glimpse of anything that looked different than the current models. Usually my efforts would be rewarded.

In 1964 I looked and saw several new vehicles through the windows. The Falcon, oh my God, it was completely different! What a radical change! It was almost square looking? How could Ford have done away with the popular rounded look? The new Galaxie was awesome! Those low slung round taillights were cool. The first time I saw one on the road it was being driven on Park Street by Bobbie Chapman Jr. himself! It was a red XL Sport Roof, the sun was setting, and the Galaxie turned onto Main Street with the sunset glistening against the red paint. Those big round taillights were bright red and she looked smooth! I rode my bike after that car until the tires slipped in a pile of horse dung from a recent Amish Buggy that had just passed through town!



Of course many of you know the Mustang was not part of that fall model year announcement in 1964. It came later in the spring, but what an unveiling! It was marketing genius rivaled only by IBM in later years! A low-slung sporty looking Ford with a horse Pedigree? I wasn't sure at first but it grew on me fast, just like the 2005 Concepts have done! Bob Chapman only had a couple Mustangs but the entire town was looking! I rode my bike out every day after the paper route was finished. I begged my Father to buy one and he admitted a new Mustang would be fun, but how would we get 4 kids, our live-in grandmother, and my mother in the car? It's too small!
